## *Good things come to those who wait...*

They say that patience is a virtue, and good things come to those who wait. So when the telephone call finally occurred in early May this year, it went something like this: "Hi Jeff! This is Ronny over at Holiday Chevrolet. Your name is finally at the top of the list."

If my memory serves me correctly, my name went on the aforementioned list for a C8 Z06 some-time during the spring of 2022. Numerous supply issues plagued Z06 production for the first 12-18 months, severely limiting supply. Compounded by astronomical customer demand, prices skyrocketed well above MSRP, with \$30K to \$50K mark-ups the most commonly-quoted prices (although some cars sold for significantly higher). No way, I told Ronny, am I paying those kind of numbers. As a long-time Corvette owner – I bought my first NEW Corvette in 1983 and have had one or more in the garage ever since – I've suffered through multiple recalls, several on-the-road DOA's, multiple repeat component failures, etc. – and yet I was still "brand loyal" to a fault, and a HUGE supporter of the marquee. That kind of allegiance has to be worth something, I asserted. "Unfortunately, right now with the Z06, it isn't", I was told.

Meanwhile, Kelly and I continued to enjoy our 2021 Zeus Bronze Z51 Coupe, driving cross country from Texas a couple of times to participate in the 2022 and 2023 NCCC National Conventions, as well as taking numerous road trips in and around Texas. I periodically stopped-in to chat with Ronny, just to say "Hi!" and keep my mug front and center in his mind. As you can tell from the opening paragraph, my persistence finally paid off.

With prices finally coming out of the stratosphere and time running out on the 2024 model year, Kelly and I quickly spec'd-out our new ride. 3LZ was the starting point. Hypersonic Gray was the color of choice, and we stayed with the Natural Dipped interior that we loved in our 2021 Z51. The Z07 package was still heavily constrained, so I opted for the Carbon Ceramic brake package by itself. We wanted a more sophisticated, low-key exterior (if there is such a thing with a Z06), so we enhanced the stealthy appearance with carbon flash painted outside mirrors and carbon fiber ground effects, along with the spider design machine-faced forged aluminum wheels. Front end lift was a must, and we added a few other complimentary touches to finish it off. I emailed it to Ronny, and the next test of our patience began...

For those not up to date on our recent adventures, during this time we are smack dab in the middle of selling our house, pulling the plug on north Texas, and moving to Pahrump, Nevada. Prior to the move, we committed to eliminating our two personal vehicles and consolidating into a single non-Corvette car for everyday use. I won't bore

you with the excruciating detail of the June 26th through July 18th timeline, but let's just say it included driving out in the 2012 Z06 and closing on our house in Pahrump, trading-in the ATS and Buick Encore, taking delivery of a LONG overdue Cadillac XT4 on the afternoon of the day we moved out, selling our house in Texas, and TWO separate 19-hour U-Haul trips - the 2nd trip precipitated by the surprise realization three-quarters of the way through the loading process that everything wasn't going to fit in the truck we had rented. Kelly's 1980 L-82 enjoyed a leisurely transport on a trailer behind the first U-Haul, and the 2024 Z06 – delivered right before I began our second moving adventure – was similarly transported behind U-Haul #2. Yes, that all occurred within a 23-day span.

As of this writing, the 2024 Z06 has completed its initial 500 mile “computer-controlled” break-in period and sits in the driveway with a little under 1200 miles on the odometer. Chevrolet requires 1500 miles before any track day activities are initiated, and I can't wait to stretch the Z06's legs, so stay tuned. For those not familiar with Pahrump, it sits just under 1-hour west of Las Vegas and is home to Spring Mountain Motor Resort and Country Club, which houses the Ron Fellows Performance Driving School. Six out of seven days a week we can hear the joyous sounds of students learning to drive Corvettes the way they were intended, as the facility sits about two miles as the crow flies due north of our house. We've signed-up Kelly for one of the Z06 schools in February, the first open slot they had. Needless to say, the “door is wide open” for any club member that decides to partake in the school or simply is visiting Las Vegas – we'd be happy to host. And we guarantee you'll enjoy the endless blue skies and incredible mountain views during your entire stay.
