# Front Page Feature Corvette— Scott Breneman

## *How not to buy a car from 8 pictures (or Scott's second Vette)*

I really enjoyed my C5Z but I was a little envious of the C6 wide-body cars, and their ability to fit wider tires front and rear. I decided it was time for a change. I sold the C5Z to a local family that took it wheel-to-wheel racing and did rather well with it. Meanwhile I was on the lookout for a wrecked C6 Stick Coupe. I found a Victory Red 2007 Z51 car at a Copart Auction in Atlanta. It was hit on the right front and had some other bumps and bruises on two of the other three corners. It didn't look that bad in the 8 pictures shown. There were details that you couldn't be sure of



from the pictures. I figured that everything that might be damaged in the pictures was damaged. That was pretty accurate. My intent was to replace these damaged base model panels with the wider Grand Sport panels. The car arrived in the middle of a torrential thunderstorm with the window down and the interior was as wet as the exterior. I immediately gutted the interior and dried everything out. I removed the damaged body panels to get a better look at what I bought. I then had Glenn, a friend with a frame shop, stop by my house and check out the frame. It was determined that the best course of action was to source a front frame section to replace my damaged one. If the car was going to be used for normal street use, it could be pulled back into shape, but he knew what my planned use of the car was and recommended replacement. I removed all the drivetrain, body panels and interior to get it ready. I called everyone I could find and could not locate a front frame. We determined that he could pull the frame to factory specs and plate or reinforce anything in question. He attempted to pull the frame and found that the frame had been damaged before and repaired poorly. This means that the car had been wrecked twice. We determined that the only way to repair it correctly was to replace the front part of the frame. I made all the same phone calls and found a front frame near Philly. I borrowed a truck and trailer and retrieved it the next day. With the replacement frame attached to mine and the whole car still attached to frame table I had Glenn weld in a good solid Rollbar. It then came back to my house for reassembly. I was working for Jones Acura at the time, so I took advantage of my employee parts discount on new GM inner structure and body panels. The body panels went to Glenn to get painted, and everything was reassembled in my garage. Once I had it all together and inspected; it looked like any other C6 Grand Sport but was only a 400hp LS2. I ran the car in this configuration for a couple years and was wanting more power. I started working on another engine for it.

Then one sunny Saturday morning at Pitt Race the brake pedal went to the floor at the end of the back straight and I parked it in the trees. When we pulled it out of the trees, I was disappointed to see that every panel except the hood and roof had noticeable damage. Here we go again.

I had driven the car out to Pitt Race for a "SCCA Track Night in America" event. These are events where there is no competition, it's just a chance to drive your streetcar on a local track. This left me stranded four hours from home with an undrivable car. This was the day I finally conceded I need a truck and trailer. I called Nick and he borrowed Rick's trailer drove out to pick me up. The car went back to Glenn to see if the frame was bent. With a clean bill of health, the rebuilding process started again. This time I decided to wrap the car instead of painting it again. While I had it apart this was a good opportunity to install the new engine and drivetrain. This time it got a twin turbo 6.2 LSA engine. At the same time, I installed a TR6060 transaxle and rear differential from a Z06. The TR6060 should be stronger than the T56 it replaced. The Z06 rear has a cooler that my Z51 didn't have. This car has been a lot of fun in this configuration but is suffering from cooling issues.

# 2024 Activities— Pool Party Recipe

## Ultimate Cowboy Caviar

Chef Lisa's crowd-pleasing cowboy caviar "is one of the greatest party dips of all time." This version uses 3 kinds of peppers—fresh, pickled, and roasted—and an easy custom dressing to take it to the next level.

**Prep Time:** 30 mins

**Chill Time:** 2 hrs

**Total Time:** 2 hrs 30 mins

**Servings:** 10

### Ingredients

#### Dressing

- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 1/3 cup seasoned rice vinegar
- 2 limes, juiced
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt, plus more to taste
- 1 teaspoon white sugar
- 1 1/4 teaspoons ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon smoked paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon chipotle pepper, or to taste

#### Caviar

- 2/3 cup finely diced red onion
- 1 1/2 cups diced fresh bell peppers
- 1/3 cup diced jalapeno peppers
- 1 (15 ounce) can black beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 (15 ounce) can black eyed peas, drained and rinsed
- 2 cups canned (drained) or frozen corn
- 1 cup diced fresh tomato
- 1/2 cup chopped fresh cilantro (optional)
- scoop-style tortilla chips for serving



### Directions

1. Whisk oil, rice vinegar, lime juice, garlic, garlic powder, salt, sugar, cumin, paprika, and chipotle together in a large bowl and set aside until needed.
2. Rinse diced onion well under cold water; drain well.
3. Add bell peppers, roasted red peppers, jalapenos, black beans, black-eyed peas, corn, and tomato to the bowl of dressing. Add red onion, stir well, cover, and refrigerate for 2 to 12 hours, tossing occasionally. Before serving, stir in cilantro. Season to taste with salt. Serve with tortilla chips.

### Chef's Notes:

Fresh, roasted, or grilled corn can be used instead of frozen.  
Half parsley and half mint can be used instead of cilantro.  
Canned diced tomatoes can be used instead of fresh.
